Working to improve access to health care in Colwood

Health is one of the strategic pathways in Colwood's draft Strategic Plan. It is also one of the themes Council asked residents about at the 2023 Ideas Fair and in the fall Life in Colwood Survey.

There is no more important issue to many Colwoodians than improved access to primary health care services.

Council took your feedback to the Minister of Health and our teams are working together to improve access to health care in Colwood.

Colwood has roughly 22,000 residents and is growing rapidly, with zero full-time doctors. The Ministry of Health defines a full-time family practice as having 1250 patients. This means Colwood needs 18 family doctors to be self sufficient.

Working to attract health care providers to a new medical clinic. Colwood is exploring an opportunity to address our community's current health care challenge in partnership with Pure Pharmacy and Aroga Lifestyle Medicine by establishing a medical clinic in a newly constructed facility at the Commons in Royal Bay.

The funding required for the consideration of this *business case* would come from Colwood's Corporate Contingency Budget. The specific funding required for *establishing* and supporting a primary health care service function will be established through business case development.

Keep an eye on The Beachlands

Seacliff & Reliance Properties have announced the start of construction at The Beachlands with a presentation centre and coffee shop overlooking the ocean. The building is envisioned as an architectural gateway, welcoming residents and visitors to a new seaside village in Colwood.



The Beachlands encompasses 134 acres of oceanfront land with 1.4 kilometres of shoreline. Colwood staff and Council worked

to ensure that over 47 acres of the property will be dedicated to parks, trails and public space, including playgrounds, nature parks, a network of trails, a covered public plaza and an amphitheatre.

The Beachlands team noted that two multifamily buildings are expected by summer 2026, followed by a waterfront plaza with pubs, restaurants, coffee shops, doctors offices, fitness facilities and more.

Planning for a new Community Centre

Access to recreation is important for health, well-being and quality of life. Colwood's Parks & Rec Master Plan calls for more recreational & community facility space as our population grows. The City has the opportunity now to secure land in the Royal Bay development, and has prepared a feasibility study to plan for a future Community Centre. The study positions the City well to apply for grants that would allow for such a project to proceed.

Increasing housing options

In recent years Colwood has enabled over 300 units of income-based housing at 2006 Sooke, 342 Wale, and 330 Goldstream.

At the same time, Colwood housing options are growing with **618** new homes (including a mix of apartments, condos, townhomes, and single family homes) permitted in 2023.

The Province is working to enable more housing. Bill 44 has the potential to increase the number of units permitted on land with sewer service and access to transit. Development in Colwood is focused in transit growth areas as outlined in the City's community-led OCP. As property owners develop, the City works to preserve connections to nature, create enjoyable public places, and enhance transportation. Learn more at Colwood.ca/DevelopmentActivity

Colwood's own sea walk Waterfront Walkway

Colwood is building a walkway along the length of the waterfront from the Lagoon Bridge to The Beachlands, supported by a \$6M federal grant.

This will provide an enjoyable route for residents and visitors to walk or cycle between the Galloping Goose at Colwood Corners and The Beachlands and Royal Bay, while protecting the sensitive ecology and archaeology of shoreline areas.

The Waterfront Stewardship Plan was developed with extensive community and stakeholder engagement that began in 2021 and will continue through ongoing consultation with the Xwsepsum and Songhees Nations during the implementation phase of the project.

First steps are underway in partnership with local Nations and the BC Archaeology Branch to ensure the protection of the sensitive ecology and archaeology of the coastline and lagoon areas.

The grant requires that the work be completed by 2028.

Updating the Transportation Plan

Since 2015, Colwood's Transportation Master Plan has provided direction for transportation improvements. What improvements, you ask? A few examples:

- Design of all roadways for new developments
- Latoria & Metchosin intersection and bus exchange
- Sidewalks on Metchosin, Painter, Benhomer, Owens
- The roundabout at Veterans Memorial & Latoria
- Plans earned a \$4M grant for the Galloping Goose Bridge and a \$6M grant for the waterfront walkway

Watch for opportunities to get involved.

In addition to public input, updates will be guided by a new traffic model that shows the impact of planned development, technical data like traffic & speed counts, and existing plans like the OCP, Active Transportation, Climate Action, and Parks & Rec Plans.

Household Prosperity: What you shared in the LIFE IN COLWOOD survey

Household prosperity considers economic factors such as income, housing and education, but also the social, cultural and environmental aspects that contribute to well being and quality of life. Here's what residents had to say during the recent Household Prosperity Survey:



Colwood is seen as a welcoming community with rich recreational opportunities.

The city is widely perceived as friendly and positive.

75% of residents actively engage in nature trails and parks weekly.



A strong sense of community and a desire for more places and ways to connect.

The need for more restaurants and small businesses was a recurring theme.

3 in 10 express interest in learning more about volunteer opportunities in the city.



Diverse opinions on prosperity, with a third saying theirs has decreased.

High cost of living and lack of affordable housing emerged as top issues among those who cannot achieve their financial goals while balancing work and life.



The employment landscape is changing, with high demand for remote work.

6 in 10 perceive employment opportunities in Colwood as limited.

52% have embraced hybrid or fully remote work for improved work-life balance.



Transportation dynamics play a crucial role in quality of life in Colwood.

40% of residents commute outside of Colwood daily, another 40% weekly.

3 in 4 residents agree that improved transportation would enhance quality of life.



Addressing healthcare access is important for residents.

69% of respondents are dissatisfied with healthcare service availability.

Top issues are difficulty in finding providers, limited facilities, and long wait times.



Concern about affordable housing, particularly for seniors and youth in Colwood.

41% of residents don't feel that buying a house in Colwood is attainable. Only 3% see affordable housing options for youth, and 18% see affordable housing for seniors.

Budget 2024 Fast Facts

Like any business or household, the needs and expectations of a municipality are often greater than what can be afforded at one time. Choices must be made based on the priorities of community and Council.

The goal is to deliver a high level of service that strikes a balance between household prosperity and city-building initiatives that enhance quality of life.

The draft 2024-2028 Financial Plan enables the City to keep pace with the maintenance, repair and anticipated replacement of an estimated \$350M+ in assets, as well as serving and protecting the safety of a growing number of residents. The plan also accounts for large capital projects like the waterfront walkway, pedestrian and cycling bridge, sidewalks, and other improvements.
