Get ready to cruise into Colwood on the Galloping Goose Bridge

The new Galloping Goose pedestrian and cycling bridge over Sooke Road is set to open in April.

The bridge will create a safer and more direct connection to the 55km regional Galloping Goose Trail that runs through the heart of Colwood on its path from Victoria to Sooke. Once open, the bridge is expected to serve more than 6,000 pedestrians and cyclists each week.

Behind the scenes, crews have been completing the final approach ramps, which are designed with a gentle 5% grade to ensure the bridge is comfortable and accessible for users of all ages and abilities.

Made possible through a \$3.6 million grant, the project supports our community's goals related to health and well-being, easing traffic congestion, attracting customers to nearby businesses, improving air quality, and reducing climate impacts.

Understanding your needs and expectations around Sewer Service

If sewer service came to your Colwood neighbourhood, would you pay to connect? It's a complex question of cost and timing for most residents.

About half of Colwood properties are connected to sewer service, with the remainder served by septic systems. While most of Colwood has great soil percability, making septic systems an effective and environmentally friendly option, most were installed a generation ago and may require upgrade or replacement in the coming years.

The City has not initiated any project to expand sewer service, but has done the work to update the Sewer Master Plan and clarify the technical details, cost estimates, and steps that would need to be taken.

Colwood Council understands the importance of making resident input the basis of any future decisions about sewer service in Colwood. They would like to gain a better understanding of what priority residents wish to place on sewer expansion in long term infrastructure planning.

Cost is a major factor for residents. Some have recently spent tens of thousands to replace their septic system which will serve them well for many years. Others are waiting to hear if sewer service might come their way before investing in septic replacement.

We very much value your input on this complicated subject. Survey results are expected to be presented to Council in the coming months and will help guide next steps and future decisions. Get advance notice of Council meeting agendas by subscribing for City updates at Colwood.ca/Subscribe.

Project UPSTREAM: Supporting Community Safety & Well-being

Colwood is one of 10 communities across Canada selected to participate in Project UPSTREAM, a Public Safety Canada initiative led by the Canadian Centre for Safer Communities (CCFSC).

What steps can we take to ensure Colwood continues to be a safe and connected community in a shifting landscape of political differences, cultural tension, and global conflict?

To understand risks and explore strategies, the City will receive extensive Colwood-specific safety data and is working with youth and partners like the School District, the RCMP, and many others through a series of focus groups. The City will then be paired with national experts and funding from Public Safety Canada to implement a pilot project designed to improve life in Colwood.

Reducing the tax hit to residents

Colwood Council is working to reduce the 2026 property tax increase from a proposed 7.54% to a targeted 4.25% while continuing to fund essential services.

Cost pressures are significant for increases related to policing, fire rescue, union contracts, and other necessary services.

Colwood has maintained a strong track record of responsible financial management, keeping average annual property tax increases below 5% since 2020. Council is committed to supporting affordability for residents.

OUR PARKS

Bridging people and nature

More than just making it easy for visitors to enjoy Colwood parks, pedestrian bridges protect vital streams and waterways in our community. They help maintain natural waterflow and allow aquatic ecosystems to thrive undisturbed by people and pets, and they protect the riparian plant life that stabilizes stream banks and prevents erosion.

These recent bridge upgrades advance the City's Parks Management Plan, which guides upgrades to park trails, connectivity, environmental conservation, and park maintenance.

Latoria Creek Park Pedestrian Bridge



The old wooden bridge near the park entrance has been replaced with a new aluminum bridge designed to last up to 50 years. Its fibre mesh deck provides a slip-resistant surface, improving safety and comfort for people exploring this scenic creekside trail between Latoria Road and Pelican Drive. Latoria Walk Park Pedestrian Bridge



The beautiful new boardwalk bridge has been replaced along the trail in Latoria Walk Park where the old bridge had become unsafe. The new bridge is expected to last approximately 50 years, helping maintain this popular connection between Latoria Road and Havenwood Park.

Colwood Creek Park Pedestrian Bridge



The pedestrian bridge crossing Colwood Creek along the trail parallel to Veterans Memorial Parkway has also been upgraded. The new structure provides a safer, longer-lasting crossing for walkers, dog owners, and anyone enjoying the park's peaceful creekside pathway. Colwood.ca/ColwoodCreekPark

What's up next for the Waterfront Walkway

Colwood's work to create a multi-use pathway along the waterfront from the Lagoon Bridge to meet trails planned at the Beachlands is on track for completion by the 2028 grant deadline, thanks to a \$6M grant from the Canada Community-Building Fund.

It's a complex project due to the sensitive archaeological and ecological features, factors like erosion and sea level rise, the various landscapes it encompasses: the Lagoon shore, the ocean shore, the small section of Ocean Boulevard, the treed area of Perimeter Park, and connections to the trails, plaza, and sidewalks planned in the new Beachlands neighbourhood.

Staff continue to work through archaeological permitting, stakeholder engagement, and design. Over the coming months, watch for opportunities to learn more about aspects like the trail surface, landscaping, vegetation, accessibility features, interpretive signs, and more.
