

Council Resolution – September 18, 2026

THAT the following September 18, 2026, In-Camera Council resolutions be released from their In-Camera classification:

- IC-2026-93 THAT Council adopts the following decision on the complaint that Councillor Jordison breached the City's conflict of interest requirements in her discussions with a developer:
1. A complaint was made about Councillor Jordison engaging with a developer in a manner which raised a conflict-of-interest issue regarding a development project that was being considered by Council.
 2. This complaint was investigated by an independent Fairness Advisor under the terms of the City's Code of Conduct.
 3. After conducting a thorough review of this matter, the Fairness Advisor concluded that Councillor Jordison's engagement with the developer raised a perception of a conflict of interest that Councillor Jordison failed to recognize by not recusing herself from consideration of the development proposal, as she should have done.
 4. Council adopts this finding, the substance of which is that Councillor Jordison was personally interested in purchasing a home or property in this project when she engaged in discussions with the developer at the same time as the project was under consideration by Council; and that the discussions with the developer raised a perception of a conflict of interest. Indeed, it is this perception that caused the developer to communicate its concern about Councillor Jordison's actions to the City.
 5. It is essential to preserving public confidence in the governance of our city that council members avoid a perception of a conflict of interest with respect to matters coming before council for consideration.
 6. Ms. Jordison's failure to recognize and accept this perception of a conflict of interest in this situation needs to be addressed by Council.
 7. To protect the public interest moving forward, Council will be implementing the following measures:
 - a. A formal written reprimand or censure of Councillor Jordison to be recorded in open Council minutes and included in the public record; and
 - b. Prohibition or restriction on participation in discussions or votes on matters directly related to the breach for a defined period, if appropriate and

permissible under the Community Charter, to be determined by Council in a subsequent resolution and;

- c. Councillor Jordison will be removed from representation on any Council Committees (internal and external) and from Acting Mayor duties for a period of 24 months;
8. Council has also decided that it is in the public interest to release the investigative report on this matter to the public, as required in the Code of Conduct policy. Council also notes that on October 17th, 2026, the Province will be implementing legislation that release will be statutorily required across the province.
9. As Councillor Jordison's commentary has attracted public attention and become a matter of public controversy, Council believes that the public needs to know why Council has decided to sanction Councillor Jordison for these ethical breaches, including removal from council committees by publicly releasing the investigative report as well as Council's decision.
10. This is not the first time Councillor Jordison has been held to have breached the City's standards of ethical conduct. A previous decision and accompanying investigation report was not released to the public at that time. However, Council has decided it is necessary for the public to be aware that there has been a previous breach of the City's standards of ethical conduct by Councillor Jordison, particularly since the complainant in that matter has requested that it be released.
11. Therefore, we are also going to release Council's previous decision on her breach of our standards along with the investigation report on this matter.

IC-2026-95 THAT the full reports be released according to the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy legislation subject to appropriate notifications to the complainants.

IC-2026-96 THAT the news release be distributed on Tuesday, September 22, 2026.
