- Public Participation:
  - o Two written submissions were received, read the correspondence
  - One member of the public addressed Council with concerns regarding rezoning the property adjacent to Veteran's Memorial Parkway
  - One member of the public voiced their support for the motion to close a portion of Ocean Boulevard during Beach Food Special Events
- **Council Supports 988 Suicide and Crisis Line Initiative:** Council received correspondence and voted to support the proposed National three-digit suicide and crisis line initiative. Read the <u>correspondence</u>.
- **Regional Letter to Advocate for Cruise Ship Traffic in Canada:** Council supports Mayor Martin signing a regional letter of support advocating for the confirmation that cruise traffic may return to Canadian waters in 2022. The current order prohibits cruise vessels in all Canadian waters until February 28, 2022. Read the <u>correspondence</u>.
- Beach Food Special Events Ocean Boulevard Closure: Mayor Martin put forward a Notice of Motion with the recommendation that in order to support Beach Food special events, Ocean Boulevard be closed for a 400-meter section to thru traffic from Friday, re-opening prior to Monday morning commuters commencing July 2 through September 5, 2021 (including statutory holidays: Canada Day, BC Day, and Labour Day). This matter will be discussed at the next Council Meeting.
- Staff to Seek Public Comment for Off-Street Parking Bylaw and Parking Variance Policy: Following a recommendation from the June 7, 2021 <u>Committee of the Whole</u> <u>Meeting</u>, Council directed staff to seek the public comment regarding the Draft Off-Street Parking Regulations Bylaw and the Draft Parking Variance Policy before returning to Council with further drafts.
- 807 Bexhill Road Staff Direction: Following a recommendation from the June 7, 2021 Committee of the Whole Meeting, Council directed staff to:
  - negotiate an amendment to the drainage statutory right of way to allow for sanitary sewer use with the owners of 3391, 3393 and 3395 Fulton Road
  - undertake an engineering review of the 873 Cuaulta Lift Station at a cost of \$21,000 funded by the Sewer Enhancement Fund

- inspect the Bexhill Place sewer system and work with the council members of Stratas VIS2419 and VIS2420 as necessary
- Bring a report to Council with results of the above tasks and cost estimates for any necessary repair and upgrade works
- Capital Region Emergency Service Telecommunications (CREST) Inc. Verbal Report: CREST provides and maintains emergency communications equipment and infrastructure for more than 50 first responder and public service agencies throughout the Capital Region. This includes fire departments, police departments and ambulance services. Councillor Jantzen, a Director of CREST provided a verbal report with a brief update on space restraints, purchasing land, and recent meetings.
- Noise Bylaw Relaxation at Thrifty Foods Location: Council approved the recommendation to relax section 6 of "Noise Control Bylaw" No. 1594, 2016 for the purpose of paving the parking lot at 1860 Island Highway. Read the <u>report</u>.
- 594 Latoria Road: Council approved DVP-21-002 for 594 Latoria Road which will vary the Land Use Bylaw No. 151 Section 10.25.6.1 Yard Requirements Side (East) from 20m to 15m. This item was considered by Committee of the Whole at the May 25, 2021 meeting and Notification requirements are now complete. Read the report from the May 25, 2021 Council Meeting and the report from the March 22, 2021 Council Meeting.
