


# Investing in community while respecting affordability

As a fast-growing seaside community, Colwood is preparing for significant change in the coming years, particularly along transit routes, in and around Colwood Corners, and at the new seaside village in Royal Bay.

Colwood Council approved a modest increase of 1.38% in municipal property taxes for 2018. Many factors impact your tax bill, including your property assessment proportion, whether you are eligible for a home owner grant, and taxes from other agencies, such as the Capital Regional District and Provincial School Taxes, which are outside the City's control.

### Ongoing improvements planned

Over the next five years, improvements are planned for streets, traffic signals, sidewalks, cycling routes, street lighting, signage, bridges, stairs, parks and trails. We'll be conducting a pavement condition assessment of all City roads, as well as a coastline erosion study and geospatial surveys of the City's natural assets.
