

# Less than half of your tax bill is municipal tax.

**52%** of the charges on your property tax bill are collected for **OTHER AGENCIES** over which the City has no direct control. It all goes on one tax notice so you don't have to deal with multiple bills.



Your property value as determined by BC Assessment is factored into your tax calculation. If your property's value increased more than the average for Colwood, the municipal portion of your tax bill may increase.

All BC municipalities are required to present a balanced budget every spring. Colwood's financial position is confirmed annually through an independent audit.

Like any business or household, the needs and expectations of a municipality are often greater than what can be afforded at one time. Difficult choices must be made based on the priorities of the community.

## Will the average Colwood household pay more for property taxes in 2021?

The average household in Colwood will see an increase of approximately \$115 in municipal taxes over last year.

This 5% overall increase allows for the provision of current services including inflation, as well as the reinstatement of services that were deferred in 2020 to ease the tax burden at the outset of the pandemic.

It also provides for increases to meet the safety needs and maintenance expectations of our growing community. These include one additional RCMP officer and one support clerk so officers can focus on policing; two new firefighters; and increased parks & trails maintenance. The goal is to deliver services to the community that strike a balance between household prosperity and city-building initiatives that will support quality of life while optimizing our tax base.

## What improvements are planned over the coming year? A few examples:


- New sidewalks + cycling lanes on Painter Road and Metchsoin Road plus a 10-year ongoing program of new sidewalks throughout the City

- Traffic Calming Pilot Projects to improve neighbourhood safety
- Park Improvement Plans guided by the new Parks & Recreation Master Plan
- Galloping Goose bridge over Sooke
   Road to increase safety and ease for
   pedestrians + cyclists (grant dependant)
- Transportation & Sewer Master Plan updates to map ongoing upgrades
