Roval Bav + Roval Beach

The City is reviewing rezoning applications from both Royal Beach and Royal Bay (south of Latoria Road).

Rezoning dictates what will be built on the land and the resulting character, density, road layouts, traffic patterns, parks planning, shoreline erosion and slope stability assessments.

These are big decisions that will shape how people live, enjoy and move around Colwood in the future.

Council and staff have asked the owners/applicants for more technical details to inform decision making.

This includes:

Absorption studies to help assess the types and quantity of new homes and businesses that best suit Colwood.

Traffic studies to illustrate how the cumulative proposed density will impact all road users and propose transportation solutions.

Parks and open space plans describe how parks will work to meet the needs of users and have a clear plan for the ongoing maintenance.

Shoreline erosion and slope stability **assessments** to guide the type and location of waterfront amenities and public spaces, and how the City will remain adaptable to a changing climate.

What's building around town? A few examples...

Allandale Lands - Veterans Memorial Parkway

near Sooke Road - The owner is preparing the site for development. Details have not been confirmed about what development is planned. The current zoning allows for a range of Mixed Employment uses.

Colwood Corners, Sooke Road - Construction is well underway on the first four commercial and residential buildings on the site. Work is expected to progress quickly on the first buildings now that the parkade concrete work is complete.

342 Wale Road - In late 2018 the Province announced \$24M in funding for new housing on this site. Construction is underway on 124 apartments in a 6 storey building.

Royal Bay Latoria South - An application to rezone the lands to the South of Latoria Road, including "the Commons" commercial area, is expected to come to Council this fall.

Royal Beach, Latoria Road - Seacliff Properties has indicated that they intend to host a third round of public open houses to share their latest plans and gather input from the community.

Olympic View, Latoria Road - The developer hosted open houses in January to present the updated area plan for new homes on the property surrounding the golf course. The first phase of construction is scheduled to begin in 2019/2020.

Ensuring the safety of Lookout Brook Dam

Did you know there is a dam at Lookout Lake? Lookout Lake is a popular spot for swimming and fishing. Most people don't think about the dam that holds the lake in place. It was built in 1958 by a private forestry company.

A 2017 assessment required by the Province found that action is required to ensure the dam meets current safety standards and will protect people in the event of a major earthquake.

Colwood Council has resolved to move forward

with upgrading the dam. Council considered several options presented in a technical report. They have directed staff and consultants to refine designs and cost estimates and submit a grant application to offset the cost of the upgrades. The detailed project, along with the outcome of the grant application will be presented for Council consideration as part of the 2020 budget process.

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Taking a hard look at how we move around Colwood

The City has been planning for growth in the Royal Bay area since the gravel pit ceased operations and the lands were purchased for development.

The new network of roads in Royal Bay are being built and paid for by the developers based on the City's road design standards, which are established through Council to meet community needs.

Colwood is now at a critical decision point as Council considers the rezoning of the Royal Beach property and the

Density decisions today will impact the number of people and cars we need to plan for in the future.



Several questions will be resolved:

- What is the plan for the intersection of Latoria and Veterans Memorial Parkway?
- Will Metchosin Road and/or Latoria Road be expanded to accommodate increasing vehicle traffic?
- How will walking, cycling, transit and ferries be leveraged to reduce traffic?

Integrated traffic studies are being prepared now by the Royal Bay, Royal Beach and Olympic View transportation consultants, based on the City's Terms of Reference. Watch for a report on the studies to be presented to Council and for public input in the coming months.

Planning for plantings: Adding beauty + interest to Colwood streets
