THE SEA

For thousands of years this shoreline was a vital source of food and a gathering place for fishing, feasting and celebration.

Along the shore, families harvested mussels, oysters, clams, barnacles, chitons, sea cucumbers, sea urchins and crabs.

Kelp was used to make fishing line to catch rockfish, salmon, cod, flounder, halibut and herring.



Hunting fishing and gathering according to season were essential to the very existence of the Lekwungen people.

As the original stewards of this land, sustainable harvesting was first and foremost.
